Students of all ages are invited to come learn about current and past practices of many local tribes. Tour groups will learn about language, dance, drumming, herbs, cooking, and many other facets of Native American Life, past and present. Our school has reserved space for 100 people. How to Get There

Take Hwy 178 to Lake Isabella and take the second exit. Go left toward Wofford Heights. When you cross the French Gulch Bridge over the lake prepare to turn right. Turn Right at French Gulch Campground. Look for the octagonal building right on the lake.: 2600 Hwy 155.

What to Expect

When we arrive we will be broken into smaller tour groups. We will be led on a tour of the building, the garden, and an area up the hill so wear sturdy shoes and dress in layers as the weather could be cold or hot. After the tour you are free so bring a lunch if you'd like to eat at the lake or bring money if you want to go a restaurant in Lake Isabella. Strollers will work in most parts of the tour. Tour guides present information via lecture, so younger students or siblings may need a quiet activity to keep them occupied. Old students may wish to take notes so they can write an essay afterwards: "Three Things I Learned About Native American Culture." Maybe even bring a camera and create a phot journal.
